

Article XV, Section 3(2) of the 1987 Constitution provides that the State shall defend the "right of children to assistance, including proper care and nutrition and special protection from all forms of neglect, abuse, cruelty, exploitation, and other conditions prejudicial to their development."

Relatedly, the Philippines, as a signatory to the United Nations Convention (UN CRC) on the Rights of the Child, is mandated under Article 19 thereof to protect the child from all forms of physical or mental violence, injury or abuse, neglect or negligent treatment, maltreatment or exploitation, including sexual abuse while in the care of parents, legal guardians, or any other person who has the care for the child. Article 28 of the UN CRC also "recognizes the right of the child to education, with the view of achieving this right progressively and on the basis of equal opportunity," and obliges the state parties to "take all appropriate measures to ensure that school discipline is administered in a manner consistent with the child's human dignity and conformity" with the said Convention.

Thus, in furtherance of the aforementioned mandates, DepEd Order No. 40, s. 2012, or the "DepEd Child Protection Policy," was issued. The Child Protection Policy enunciates this Department's zero-tolerance policy against all forms of abuse, violence, exploitation, neglect, discrimination, and all other conditions prejudicial to the development of the learners. However, after the adoption of the Child Protection

Policy, several laws were passed by Congress to address issues related to child protection that are not yet covered by the said policy, such as, but not limited to the following: Republic Act (R.A.) No. 10173, or the "Data Privacy Act of 2012," R.A. No. 11053 or the "Anti-Hazing Act of 2018," and R.A. No. 11313 otherwise known as the "Safe Spaces Act of 2019."

Consequently, like other aging guidelines, D.O. 40 needs to be evaluated, updated, and, subsequently, revised, in order to cover the aforementioned laws and to also contemplate new trends and practices related to child protection.

Consistent with its function to "formulate policies concerning all matters pertaining to the right of the child in basic education to protection from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect, cruelty, exploitation, and maltreatment," and just in time for the 10th anniversary of the Child Protection Policy, this Office, deems it imperative to conduct the program titled, "Ten Years of Child Protection in DepEd: Review, Writeshop, and Consultation Workshop Series for the Revision of the Child Protection Policy."

This activity seeks to revisit the milestones, achievements, and challenges encountered by the Department in establishing its Child Protection programs, as well as to consolidate all best practices of the Regional (ROs) and Schools Division Offices (SDOs) in implementing the Child Protection Policy.

Under the said workshop series, there will be two (2) activities which will be conducted this month. The details are as follows:

(ESSD)¹ and the Schools Governance and Operations Division (SGOD),² to **consolidate** the **Child Protection Programs, Projects and Activities** (CP-PPAs) of their respective Regions and present the same in the activity on the 25th to 26th of May. Therefore, all ROs are expected to produce the following documents:

1. Consolidated CP-PPAs of the ROs and the SDOs under its jurisdiction

- Purpose: To evaluate and gather all DepEd PPAs on Child Protection
- Scope: 2012-present
- Format: see attached Annex A of this memorandum

2. Presentation relative to the CP-PPAs of each region highlighting its best practices

- Purpose: The sharing activity of CP-PPAs and best practices aims to be
 a learning exchange activity to gain knowledge from the range of
 experiences in the ROs and SDOs.
- Schedule of presentation: see attached Annex B of this memorandum

In consolidating the CP-PPAs, the ROs and SDOs, through their Child Protection focal persons from the ESSDs and SGODs, shall follow these guidelines:

- a. The ROs shall lead the consolidation and review of all the CP-PPAs from the SDOs following the format attached in this memorandum;
- b. The SDOs shall likewise coordinate with their ROs for the submission of CP-PPAs following the same format attached in this memorandum;
- c. As to the presentation, the ROs, in coordination with the SDOs under its jurisdiction, shall decide as to **what** programs they will present in the event on May 25-26, 2022. The ROs and SDOs shall also decide as to **who** will present the report of the Region;
- d. The presentation shall contain a summary of the CP-PPAs with short descriptions, in the view of showcasing good practices in the implementation of the Child Protection Policy;
- e. Each RO has fifteen (15) minutes to present the summary of their CP-PPAs. After each report, Child Protection experts from the partner Organizations of CPU shall have five (5) minutes to give their feedback; and
- f. The consolidated CP-PPAs and presentation per Region shall be submitted to the Child Protection Unit (CPU) on or before May 24, 2022 at cpu@deped.gov.ph (cc: oure@deped.gov.ph).

This Office is looking forward to your participation in the above-mentioned events as we pursue our shared goal to provide quality, enabling, and liberating basic education to the Filipino learners by protecting them from all forms of violence,
