



2019 REGIONAL SEARCH FOR THE MOST DRRM COMPLIANT SCHOOL (BEST SCHOOL DRRM IMPLEMENTER)

TO: Schools Division Superintendents
Heads, Public Elementary and Secondary Schools

- 1. The Department of Education CAR is conducting the 2019 Regional Search for the 2019 BEST SCHOOL DRRM IMPLEMENTER (elementary and secondary level). The search aims assess the awareness, preparedness and capacities of schools to prepare and manage possible disasters or emergencies with the end goal of ensuring the safety of school children and personnel within the school campus.
- 2. The search will be conducted on the following criteria:

a. Enabling Environment -

23%

b. Safe Learning Facilities-

35%

c. School Disaster Risk Management-

30%

d. DRR in Education

- 12%
- 3. Schools Divisions are invited to submit one entry for the elementary level and one entry for the secondary level.
- 4. Evaluation of documents and validation of entries shall be conducted by representatives from the Office of Civil Defense, Bureau of Fire Protection and Department of Public Works and Highways, with DepEd as the secretariat.
- 5. Plaques of Recognition shall be given to the First, Second and Third place winners while Certificates of Participation shall be given the non-winners. Certificates of Recognition shall also be given to the School Principals and School DRRM Coordinators of the participating schools.
- 6. Complete documents should be submitted to the Education Support Services Division on or before October 31, 2017 to qualify for the Search. Evaluation of entries and validation of entries will be conducted in November while awarding of winners will be on December 2018. Interested participants are requested to contact their Division DRRM Coordinators for more information or clarification.

MECHANICS FOR THE 2019 SEARCH FOR THE BEST SCHOOL DRRM IMPLEMENTER

- 1. The **SEARCH FOR THE 2019 BEST SCHOOL DRRM IMPLEMENTER** will cover the period October 2018 September 2019. Only those activities conducted within these dates will be considered for the search.
- 2. The search shall have two (2) categories: Elementary Level and Secondary Level, thus each Schools Divisions may submit two entries: 1 elementary school entry and 1 secondary school entry. Stand Alone Senior High Schools may compete under the secondary school Category.
- 3. The Comprehensive School Safety Checklist (page 2 of this enclosure) shall be used in evaluating the school entries.
- 4. Timelines for the Search are as follows:

Deadline for the submission of entries - October 31, 2019

Validation of Entries - - - November 11, 2019 onwards

Awarding of Winners - - - December 2019

- 5. Evaluators shall be composed of the following:
 - a. Office of Civil Defense Representative
 - b. Bureau of Fire Protection Representative
 - c. Department of Public Works & Highways Representative
- 6. Criteria for judging are as follows:

a. Enabling Environmentb. Pillar 1 c. Pillar 2 d. Pillar 3 TOTAL - 23 points

7. There shall be three winners (1st, 2nd, 3rd) in both the elementary and secondary level. All participating schools shall be awarded Certificates of Recognition and winners shall be awarded Plaques of Recognition.
